Closing the RETAIN ME project in the best possible way: From partner-countries’ promotional workshops to the final meeting and conference in Sweden

RETAIN ME partners never take a break! These last few weeks, partner-organisations were busy organizing their multiplier events, marking the closure of the project in each partner-country with a **promotional workshop** on ‘The Future of Remote Working’, in audiences of adult trainers, adult learners, HR people, decision-makers, etc. The project results, i.e. the Employer’s Toolkit – PR1, the Vulnerable Employee Toolkit – PR2, and the MOOC – PR3, which hosts PR1 and PR2 along with a Community of Practice (CoP), were presented and an opportunity was given to the participants to discuss the project achievements and provide their feedback and evaluation.

In marking the closure of the project, the **final meeting and conference** was held in Sweden, in the calm and picturesque city of Kristianstad. With a focus on an overview of the project’s achievements, the leading organization with the contribution of all partners, introduced the participants to good practices and possibilities of remote working, which remains a trendy topic and a priority. The conference gave partners the opportunity to display and disseminate the project’s results, in an attempt to support older and vulnerable employees to live and thrive in our digitally enhanced, remote working reality. Partners welcomed a meaningful discussion on remote working, which continued during the post conference networking session.

During the **final partners’ meeting**, held after the conference, partners discussed the final steps of the project and exchanged ideas regarding the project’s further dissemination and sustainability.
